- Focus beyond property on improving quality of life despite challenges of ageing






- It's a people business






- Diversity of the UK sector is our strength

#### Shape of the housing-with-care sector








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- UK planning system is failing older people
- Clarity needed that ensures the right types of housing for older people are built
- Should require local authorities to plan for minimum levels
- Specific use class or clarification on C2?





- Leasehold: limited flexibility for both operators and new and existing customers
- Leasehold system is changing
- International context: Move away from leasehold structure
- Needs to be backed up by specific legislation





- Legislative 'patchwork'
- Gaps in consumer protection and operator certainty
- Consolidation of disparate legislation
- Changing legislative requirements
- Follows international best practice and precedent (e.g. NZ Retirement Villages Act 2003)





- ARCO Consumer Code in operation since 2015
- 200 assessments since then
- Aimed at preventing problems before they occur
- Bridges the gap until legislation comes into effect
